

Parish Council and Community Report Jan 25

Flooding Emergency; Storm Bert

12 residents attended the December Parish Council meeting to share their experiences and concerns during the village flooding on 24 November following the unprecedented rainfall. Serious flooding took place in the following areas: Rommel Lane, Goosey Corner, Tetbury Lane, The Street and Tuners Lane and the School area.

The council agreed to review our Emergency Plan in the light of the emergency, and Cllr. Berry agreed to expedite alleviation activities through Wiltshire Council, to ensure that the drainage team took action to clear gullies, drains and ditches within their jurisdiction.

We are particularly grateful to our Street Leaders group who were able to speedily communicate flooding emergencies and allow us to direct help where needed. Many thanks also to all those residents who came out to help those affected and to manage traffic.

Following the emergency Ben Preece has set up Crudwell FLAG; a volunteer group that provides a focus and voice for community issues, shares knowledge about flood prevention, and works to ensure waterways are kept clear.

The group is currently made up of residents whose homes and property are at high risk from flooding or have previously flooded. Flood Action Groups exist all around the UK, supported by the National Flood Forum:

Since Storm Bert, Crudwell FLAG has:

- Met up to listen to each other and find common causes of concerns.
- Walked the village's watercourses to find blockages and bottlenecks.
- Created an issue tracker so that community concerns get seen through to completion.
- Shared information in the parish Facebook group about how to report blocked drains and gullies.
- Shared information about new flood defence products with the village school.
- Asked Wiltshire Council to clear a critical gulley outside the village school.
- Obtained updated mapping from utility companies.

Parish Council

The Parish Council last met on Tuesday 3 December. Meeting minutes are published on our website http://www.crudwell-pc.gov.uk/category/agenda/ together with the agenda for the next meeting which will take place at 7:00 PM on Tuesday 14 January at the Village Hall. Public speaking is permitted during the first ten minutes of the meeting, Gary Lawes has resigned from the Council; Gary has been a significant contributor to Council work for a number of years. 2021 Neighbourhood Plan; Tuners Lane Planning Application PL/2023/09595

There has been no update on the progress of the Planning Application for this site which was allocated in the 2021 Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan. Meanwhile the Application for the site in Tuners Lane remains called in by Councillor Berry.

Neighbourhood Plan Review to 2038

- In 2023 the Parish Council agreed to commence a review of the 2021 plan to align with the emerging Wiltshire Local Plan which will state Wiltshire's housing requirements to 2038.
- However, the Governments has recently published a revised version of the National Planning and Policy Framework (NPPF) which sets out a mandatory requirement on Councils in terms of the number of houses to be built. These compulsory targets will inevitably increase the allocation for Wiltshire which will therefore affect the number of houses we are required to build in Crudwell by 2038.
- The current review was designed with flexibility in order that any change in requirement in terms of housing could be accommodated. We are therefore taking professional advice on the likely impact of the new targets on us in order that we can ensure that the Plan will be acceptable.
- The Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan was "made" (completed and included in Wiltshire Council Local Plan) in May 2021. This gives us protection from speculative planning applications for unwanted developments for five years to May 2026. It is therefore imperative that we proceed to "make" the Plan by then in order that we continue to be protected from large unwanted speculative developments.
- Fresh discussions are therefore taking place with Neighbourhood Steering Group members and landowners who responded to the call for sites made as part of our 2023 consultation in the light of the likely new housing requirements. The discussions are focussed on demonstrating the suitability and deliverability of housing on these sites which would meet the parish's requirement for new homes by 2038. We will have more information on this issue soon and hope to informally consult with you in the February issue of WOIC.
- Work on the other areas of policy continues, these new policy areas include proposed Protected Green Spaces, the green network and hedgerow, Business Park, Business Development and an additional Parking Facilities Policy to ease congestion at the Primary School, also a new Design Guide to meet Government requirements.
- We are pleased to report that we have secured the resources required to develop our required new Crudwell Design Code.
- The changes in Government policy and other external issues which are beyond our control mean that we have had to revise our plan timetable, and we now anticipate that the next formal consultation called Reg 14 will take place during the Spring of 2025. We will of course continue to keep you informed at all stages.
