



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Crudwell Flood Action Group

Crudwell Flood Action Group (FLAG) is an independent voluntary organisation set up by residents in response to the flooding caused by storm Bert last December. It aims to share experience and knowledge about local flooding and to promote improved flood prevention measures for the future.

Members of FLAG have been meeting to share experiences of the recent flooding and have now completed a 13-page report on how Crudwell was affected. I would like to express my thanks to everyone who has contributed and, through our feedback process, ensured the accuracy of what was recorded. In total, around 40 properties, including the Primary School, were affected by floodwater, either within buildings or on gardens and driveways. The Parish Council can now use our research to report to Wiltshire Council on the extent of flooding in the parish.

We have gathered hundreds of photos of both the recent and previous floods, which we hope will provide a visual record for reference purposes. Some of these are included in our report and the others will be archived. Many thanks for Graham and Dawn Wasey for sharing their considerable collection of photos, many of which have helped us estimate the depth of water at its peak. Drone footage of any future floods would be extremely useful, so if there's a licenced drone pilot out there who would be willing to help, please do get in touch.

The group believes that many different factors contributed to the serious impact the flooding had on the village, such as the size of culverts, the management of watercourses and the effectiveness of warning systems.

We hope that FLAG will develop a constructive working relationship with the Parish Council so that the expertise of both groups can be harnessed to provide fresh focus on the systemic flooding issues in the village.

It's a fantastic pastime, full of daring, creativity, and dedication, and an incredibly supportive and positive community.

Flooding Emergency; Storm Bert

Further to the meeting of the 3rd December, a number of members of Crudwell Flood Action Group (FLAG) attended the meeting of the 14th January to review progress. It was agreed that a Parish Councillor would join the FLAG group in order to establish effective communications and promote synergy of effort. The Parish Council agreed to follow up on actions to review the Parish Emergency Plan, to survey the village watercourses with members and to communicate with landowners who have riparian rights seeking to ensure that issues are effectively managed or escalated to Wiltshire Council.

Neighbourhood Plan Report

2031 Neighbourhood Plan Allocation; Tuners Lane

The agents for the Tuners Lane site have agreed to host an exhibition showing the final designs for the site. We will publicise the date for this when it has been arranged. Meanwhile, the Planning Application remains called in for North Wiltshire Planning Committee review.

2038 Neighbourhood Plan Review

- Following our information last month regarding the impact of the new Government housing targets and having taken professional advice, we now understand that the number of additional homes required in Crudwell by 2038 for the Neighbourhood Plan Review will be in the region of 39 units. This is an increase of 28 in addition to the 25 houses planned for Tuners Lane and other local committed developments.
- The Crudwell Neighbourhood Plan was "made" (completed and included in Wiltshire Council Local Plan) in May 2021. This gives us protection from speculative planning applications for larger unwanted developments for five years to May 2026. It is therefore imperative that we continue to complete the Plan Review by then in order that we continue to be protected from such developments.
- If we fail to deliver the Plan Review, then the situation here could be very much more threatening with large developments being planned or allocated in and around the village (as in Tetbury and Malmesbury) with little or with no increase in our infrastructure and facilities.
- Our last consultation included a call for sites and two landowners responded with proposals
 to make sites available for housing development. A working group of the Neighbourhood
 Plan Steering Group is in discussion with the landowners and their agents to establish the
 viable sites which could be delivered by 2038. It is likely that these sites could in time
 provide our housing allocations to meet the new targets, thus keeping us safe from
 proposed developments which could be much bigger.
- We promised that we would consult with you at all stages while we draft the plan in order that you are fully informed. We hope to be able to tell you which sites we may be able to allocate, with the potential number of homes for each, in next month's edition of this journal, together with an opportunity to express your views. Watch this space!


