Crudwell Flood Action Group

Volunteers have continued to meet fortnightly, to ensure that issues affecting flood risk and resilience are being written down and communicated. To date, we have :

- 1. Created a **Maintenance List for the Parish Council**, which itemises 13 important activities that should be started immediately. The list includes what we believe is the most important maintenance job of all: clearing under under the road bridge so that the Swill Brook flows unimpeded. Even if you are a resident living at the other end of the village, this affects you! We talked the full maintenance list through with the Parish Council, and handed it over in mid-February for their ownership going forward.
- 2. Created a **List of Questions for Wiltshire Council**, asking whether they can enlarge culverts under the roads, improve surface drainage in specific places, and make other simple changes that we believe would improve resilience. The Parish Council said they intend to ask Cllr Berry if he might take these to appropriate people at the Council, such as the Principal Drainage Engineer. As an alternative, we would encourage the PC to take the questions to the Wiltshire Flood Working Group and pursue answers via that forum.
- 3. Helped the **village school** by providing the Headteacher with detailed information about the floods, which he was able to send to his own contacts at Wiltshire Council. The school received timely and helpful responses, including some advice for Crudwell on where to seek funding and also the process to follow for appointing flood wardens in the future.
- 4. Attended the **South Cotswolds Flood Summit** in Cricklade on the 1st March. We were asked to present first and gave an overview of the impact of flooding here, plus issues and ideas going forward. A common theme across this part of the county was the lack of maintenance of culverts (where water is channelled under a road) and underneath bridges, and there was a lot of negativity about the Environment Agency in its current guise. After the summit we shared our written work with the MPs team to maximise the chance that one day in the future the village is near the top of a list for better support.

If you want to put your weight behind any of these issues, you could:

- a. Talk to the Parish Council to ask when maintenance near your house will be done.
- b. Contact Cllr Berry, to encourage him to seek answers from Wiltshire Council about roads and drains.
- c. Contact the local MP, and sign up for her flood resilience campaign: https://www.rozsavage.uk/campaigns/improve-flood-resilience-in-the-south-cotswolds
- d. Report overflowing drains when you see them to Wessex Water, or problems with Highways drainage on the MyWilts app.
- e. Talk to the Flood Action Group if you would like information about flood defences for your home or can share information with others in the community.

Crudwell Village Hall

With the sun making its first real appearance this month, it's been so nice to see people using the field, playground, tennis courts, and the new path at the village hall on such a regular basis. Investigations continue to source funding for the bicycle 'pump' track at the bottom of the field but all the pieces for our new goalposts are now with us so these will be installed very soon. Benches and picnic tables to go around the field are now a priority, so we hope to have some news on those soon.

Also, we've been excited to discover a free tree sourcing and delivery service from the Woodland Trust, which we'll be using to continue the tree-planting programme for the rest of the field. Providing for native species of insect, bird, and mammal is high in our minds as we work through this to do all we can for biodiversity and our own enjoyment of this precious green space. All in all, our new 'park' is taking shape, and we appreciate all the support from the community in helping us to make it happen.

In other news, there has been a snag with our proposed new vending machine – namely that weather protection hadn't been factored in. As a result, discussions continue but this could take some time.

Finally, by the time you read this, our AGM will have been and gone – we'll update any outcomes from that meeting here next month, including the latest roll call of trustees, officers, and committee members. As ever, if you'd like to play your part just let me know!

Parish Council April

Parish Council

The Parish Council last met on Tuesday the 18th of March 2025. Meeting minutes are published on our website at: http://www.crudwell-pc.gov.uk/category/agenda/ together with the agenda for the next meeting which will take place at 7:00 PM on Thursday the 24th of April 2025 in **Crudwell Primary School**. Public speaking is permitted during the first ten minutes of the meeting, and you are, if you wish able to attend.

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Thursday the 13th of May in Crudwell School.

Flood prevention and Crudwell Flood Action Group (FLAG)

Councillors have held further meetings with representatives of Crudwell FLAG and reviewed a long-term plan of requests to assess a number of drainage infrastructure installations to determine that these are working effectively and if improvements are possible to better alleviate flooding in the future. Most of the items fall under the auspices of Wiltshire Council and will be raised directly with the appropriate department. The PC will review the items which fall within its riparian responsibilities. Further activities are as follows:

- The Council has communicated with local landowners reminding them of riparian responsibilities to ensure that watercourses on their land are well maintained.
- Liaison with Wiltshire Council continues to ensure that culverts and ditches within their jurisdiction are well maintained.
- Additional road signs and gel sacks have been obtained and are available for use.
- The Parish's Emergency Plan is under review to ensure that all possible scenarios are covered.
- A Parish Councillor liaises directly as a member of Crudwell FLAG with a monthly report back to Council meetings. You can find information in the Facebook group, or via: crudwellflag@gmail.com
- Representatives of Crudwell Flag presented at MP Roz Savage's Flood recent summit meeting in Cricklade.

Neighbourhood Plan April

Plan Allocation; Tuners Lane

An exhibition of the final designs and layout for the Tuners Lane site will be held at the Village Hall on the 27th of March from 4:00 till 7:00 pm. All Crudwell parish residents are welcome to attend. Representatives of the site agents will be present to answer your questions. Meanwhile, the Planning Application remains called in for North Wiltshire Planning Committee review.

2038 Neighbourhood Plan Review

- Many thanks to those of you who have responded to our Neighbourhood Plan bulletin outlining our proposed NP approach to the impact of the new Government housing targets which require an additional 39 additional homes in Crudwell by 2038. The comments page remains open until March the 30th and your comments, which are welcome, can be made online on our website at https://www.my-crudwell.org. We will respond to all comments individually and summarise our findings in next month's bulletin.
- Work on other aspects of the plan, including commissioning the detailed maps and plans of the potential sites which will be included in our allocation policies, continues in order that these can be subjected to Strategic Environmental Assessment. The sites, as reported previously, are located at Carpenters Yard and land behind Chapel Way. Additionally, the feasibility of a parking facility and safe school access in the northern Glebelands, designed to alleviate congestion by the school and village green, is currently being assessed and may be included as an allocation policy. All these site allocations will be subject to appropriate permissions.
- Work has now commenced on the required Crudwell Design Code following a tour of the village by the commissioned architectural consultants during February. A presentation of the proposed themes and contents of the design code will be exhibited for all to review during early April 2025. Details of the venue, date and times will be published on our website, our Facebook page and via our my-crudwell mailing list shortly. Greetings from All Saints Church

Where's the Body? Luke 24. vs 1-2

There is abundant evidence that Jesus lived & died. Few would dispute this. The more provocative question is whether he died & lived. If Jesus rose from the dead, as millions of Christians declare every Easter, then we must accept all that He said. But "If he didn't rise from the dead ...why worry about any of what he said. The issue on which everything hangs is not whether or not you like his teaching, but whether or not he rose from the dead." (Timothy Keller)

Jesus had said he would die and rise from the dead after 3 days. This was well known and is the reason guards were assigned by the authorities to watch the tomb, with a seal set. (Matthew 27:66)

What happened next has been debated for 2,000 years.

In our text, on the day after the Sabbath, the women go to the tomb with spices, to finish anointing Jesus' body. To their shock, they find the stone rolled away and the body gone.

Suggestions have been made that Jesus didn't really die but came to his senses and somehow got out of the tomb; that the disciples went to the wrong tomb, that someone else removed the body and that reports of his subsequent sighting were a case of mass hallucination.

You will probably have your own perspective on this.

I find it fascinating to look at how the disciples responded in the weeks and years that followed.

They were *transformed* people. The timidness and fear that had caused them to abandon Jesus or betray him, that had them trembling behind closed doors, vanished. They were emboldened; they declared unequivocally that they had seen Jesus alive.

Doubters suggest they lied and spread the rumour that Jesus had been raised from the dead for some agenda of their own. Some agenda! Chuck Colson who went to prison for his part in the Watergate Scandal, points out that, 'Jesus' disciples were willing to be ostracized, beaten, persecuted, and all but one of them suffer a martyr's death'.

And liars always get found out!

Colson goes on to say of himself and his co-conspirators,

There were no more than a dozen of us. Could we maintain a cover-up to save the president? Consider that we were political zealots. We enjoyed enormous political power and prestige. With all that at stake, you'd expect us to be capable of maintaining a lie to protect the president... But we couldn't do it...

Christ's disciples, by contrast, persevered boldly with their story, 'without ever [once] renouncing their conviction that they had seen Jesus bodily resurrected?'

This deserves consideration.

The only explanation which makes any sense at all is that Jesus really did rise from the dead. And this is a life-changing, hope-filled message! It is the message of the Gospels.

If you have not ever or recently read one of the Gospels - I encourage you to do so.

Matthew, Mark, Luke or John, can each be read in a couple of hours with a good glass of wine or a few of cups of tea.

If you do one exciting and dangerous thing this Easter, I hope it won't be base-jumping. I hope it will be this!
